



Neal Boortz Auctions Off Antique Car to Benefit WSB-AM Care-A-Thon

Neal Boortz, Jones Radio Networks' nationally syndicated talk personality and firebrand host of *The Neal Boortz Show*, recently donated his 1925 Chevrolet Cabriolet to be auctioned off during the 6th Annual News/Talk 750 WSB-AM Care-a-Thon.

Held Aug. 24 & 25, proceeds from the 37-hour marathon broadcast benefited the Aflac Cancer Center and Blood Disorders Service of Children's Healthcare of Atlanta.

During his broadcast, Boortz shared stories of hope and inspiration from Aflac Cancer Center patients, families and staff, while also promoting the auction.

"The good folks at Carl Black of Roswell took over the restoration process of the car and have done a spectacular job," said Boortz. "Every single penny raised from the auction of this car will go to the Aflac Cancer Center."

"I was in the midst of some of the bravest parents and children I've ever known," added Boortz.

With the help of Boortz and fellow WSB-AM host Clark Howard, the 2006 Care-a-Thon raised more than \$1,269,000 and has now raised a total of \$4.5 million for the Aflac Cancer Center.

Boortz's Chevrolet netted \$35,000 on the auction block.

The Aflac Cancer Center treats more than 300 new cancer patients each year, has over 22,000 visits to its outpatient facilities each year and follows nearly 1,500 children with sickle cell disease, hemophilia and other bleeding disorders.
