KLOS and the American Red Cross set stage for massive blood drive 34th annual blood drive poised to draw more than 6,000 pints of blood

LOS ANGELES (July 20, 2015) – The 34th annual 95.5 KLOS Blood Drive, one of the largest media-sponsored blood drives in the country, is gearing up to prevent a summer shortage of the community blood supply. Once again, the American Red Cross and 95.5 KLOS are coming together to rock Southern California's airwaves and donor locations with a five-day blood collection effort aimed at stabilizing the region's blood supply for more than 160 hospitals.

The 34th annual 95.5 KLOS Blood Drive kicks off a 20-site tour on Tuesday, July 21, and wraps up on Saturday, July 25. Rock lovers across the Southland are invited to donate at any of the 20 blood drive sites throughout San Bernardino, Riverside, Ventura, Orange, Los Angeles, and San Diego counties.

95.5 KLOS fans won't want to miss the opportunity to see Gary Moore broadcast live from the Pomona Donor Center on Tuesday, July 21, from 2 - 7 p.m. and at the Woodland Hills Donor Center on Thursday, July 23, from 2 - 7 p.m.

About the KLOS Blood Drive

In 1981, 95.5 KLOS organized its first Red Cross blood drive at Los Angeles High School, collecting 250 pints of blood. More than three decades later, the KLOS Blood Drive has grown from a single-site, single-day event to a multi-site, multi-day event — making it one of the largest media-sponsored blood drives in the country. With the help of thousands of Southern California blood donors, the KLOS Blood Drive has collected more than 153,000 units of blood since 1981 for patients needing blood and blood products. This summer, the Red Cross and KLOS anticipate a phenomenal public turnout to break past records for the most blood collected.

95.5 KLOS has been recognized with many prestigious awards for its dedication to the community and received the American Association of Blood Bank's (AABB) prestigious Award of Merit for the Radio category in Montreal in October 2008. KLOS also was named one of five finalists nationwide to receive the National Association of Broadcasting's Legendary Station Award at the Marconi Awards in September 2006. In 2005, the station received both the Service to America Radio Partnership Award and the Crystal Radio Award, marking the first time that one radio station has been honored with both awards in the same year. How to donate blood

Simply call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or visit redcrossblood.org to make an appointment or for more information. All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age (16 with parental consent in California), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.
