Registration on Saturday June 14<sup>th</sup> will begin at 8:30am and the run will begin at 10am. Officers from the Marion County Sheriff's Office will be escorting all riders safely through the beautiful scenic roads of Marion County.

"Tragedy can strike anywhere and we want to ensure the families of our fallen heroes are well taken care of.
