

Men's Expo and Texas Hold 'em Tournament on the Jersey Shore

The New Jersey Nets will be conducting a Foul Shot Competition and New Jersey Devil Rob Skriac will signing autographs from 2-3pm. Food and beverages will be available. Entry fee for the Men's Expo is \$5.
